FACTS AT A GLANCE

The Pearl Beach Arboretum Ephemeral Art Trail (PBEAT) will run in Autumn from Saturday 22 March until Sunday 27 April 2025.

PBEAT creates inspiring temporary public art in a beautiful bushland setting. The installations must promote nature conservation, support community identity and increase the cultural vibrancy on the NSW Central Coast. Community groups and artists will be invited to enter ideas in all art forms inspired by the local environment of Pearl Beach and the Central Coast. Preference is given to proposals that use natural Australian plant materials.

PBEAT2025 will be open to the Public for free during daylight hours. There will be at least 30 artworks on display and the ability to vote for the People's Choice Award. On five weekends the Arboretum Cottage will feature music, dance and workshops.

A special part of PBEAT2025 will be an 'Artist in Residence' funded by Central Coast Council through their 'Creative Art Central Program.



- Pearl Beach is a small coastal bushland village situated approximately 40km due north of the Sydney CBD (92km by road), but separated from the city by Broken Bay and the Hawkesbury River.
- The Pearl Beach Arboretum (officially known as the Crommelin Native Arboretum) is 5.5 hectares of natural bushland in the south western corner of Pearl Beach. It is managed by a committee of local volunteers and has a magnificent open area that has been the setting for many concerts.
